



THE AFRICA INITIATIVE EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The Africa Initiative's exchange program supports short-term academic placements for Africans and Canadians undertaking research on Africa across five thematic areas—conflict resolution and mediation, energy, food security, health, and migration—with special attention to the cross-cutting issue of climate change. The exchange program is building capacity by giving bright, highly-motivated students and lecturers an opportunity to discover and impart new learning in a cross-cultural and cross-disciplinary experience. Current rounds of exchange participants are hosted at the University of Waterloo and Wilfrid Laurier University and partnering African institutions, including Makerere University—and benefit from close ties with researchers at The Centre for International Governance Innovation (CIGI).

“The specific objective of the Africa Initiative's exchange program is to support capacity building for field-based research on critically important areas to the continent among African and Canadian scholars.”

The program is granted to fifteen African students (five students per semester) and fifteen Canadian students (fifteen students in the summer semester). Each student spends up to four months abroad as a participant. The program covers all exchange-related costs including round-trip airfare, accommodations, health insurance and incidental fees, and an additional grant to cover subsistence costs.

Final candidates are selected through a careful review process conducted by the Africa Initiative's Exchange Program Coordinator, the Project Director and the Africa Initiative's Advisory Board, in collaboration with the host universities. Selected participants are notified of their acceptance into the program through formal letters of acceptance by the host university.

The exchange program is part of CIGI's larger Africa Initiative program. The Africa Initiative is a five-year, donor-supported undertaking with the Salama SHIELD Foundation in cooperation with Makerere University. The Africa Initiative supports projects in research, student/scholar

exchange, and knowledge dissemination through an online portal, all focusing on critical challenges of importance to Africa along five thematic areas—conflict resolution, energy, food security, health, and migration, with special attention to the cross-cutting theme of climate change.
