promote and strengthen scientific research and publications among the academic

staff and students. This we believe will not only open up our research for more

critical acclamation, but also help improve the University rankings, and make the

available to us, the more informed our decision making processes hence our

problem solving abilities will be. Research requires time, effort, and sometimes

money to have the evidence you need, and this always impacts on the future of a
