I am here to represent the His Excellency the President who has sent his warm regards to you. Your Excellency Benjamin Mkapa and other Makerere Alumni, Makerere University is delighted to receive you as one of the most outstanding Alumni of this institution. I am also delighted as an Alumnus and former Chancellor of this University, to join you at the Re-Union at Makerere University, an institution I cherish.
