Carnegie Corporation of New York has extended support to Makerere University to implement the project titled: “Building, Nurturing and Retaining the next generation of African Academics” under the broad theme of **Food, Nutrition and Value Addition**.

Part of this grant will support twenty (20) emerging Junior Academics (at least 30% women) to complete their doctoral degrees by providing tuition and research funds. The expected outcome is excellent PhD graduates that would bring dynamism in the university, contribute to national development and be part of the international community of scholars.

The applicants must meet the following conditions:

1. They must be members of academic staff at Makerere University from any discipline.
2. Applicants could be at any stage of their PhD studies e.g. early, middle or late or requiring only supplementary funds to complete the research projects
3. The concept/proposal must address the broad theme of **Food, Nutrition and Value Addition**
4. The concept/proposal should have been approved by the respective Faculty Higher Degree and Research Committee.
5. If registered in another university, evidence of academic status and approval of the research proposal by the appropriate organ in that university be provided
6. However, provision has been made for prospective PhD students who are yet to secure admission to Makerere University to apply on recommendation by the Faculty/School/Institute
7. Maximum period to complete the PhD is four years
8. Potential PhD students from Social Sciences, FEMA, MTSIFA, ISAE, MDD are strongly encouraged to apply.

Level of support

Research support covers both tuition and research costs

N.B: Female Academics are strongly encouraged to apply

The expected outcome is excellent graduates mentored to embark on research that will contribute to national development and be part of the international community of scholars.

The School of Graduate Studies now invites applications to compete for these funds. Applicants must meet the following conditions:

1. They must be members of academic staff at Makerere University from any discipline
2. They must complete masters program in a maximum period of two years
3. Staff at any level of their Masters degree program are eligible to apply i.e. freshly admitted, those in first or second year of their study
4. Fifty percent (50%) of the grant is reserved for female applicants

Level of support

Support includes tuition and research costs based on activities.
