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What is ICRA?

ICRA is an international centre established by European members of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR) to develop leadership in facilitating knowledge-based rural and agricultural development.

ICRA does so by providing training and coaching to professionals and to inter-organisational and multidisciplinary teams of staff from education, research and development organisations, in the following 4 focal areas:

- Agricultural Research for Development (ARD)
- · Interactive learning

- · Agribusiness coaching
- · Higher Education outreach and action research

Although grounded in cutting edge theory, ICRA's programmes are pragmatic (non-academic) and based on learning-by-doing.

ICRA strongly believes in the power of connected individuals and therefore actively supports learning networks and partnerships to foster new individual, organisational and inter-organisational forms of collaboration.

ICRA has a track record in building learning networks, together with its alumni, at both local, national, and regional levels to address complex and evolving development challenges.

Such learning networks can take different forms. They may exist just for the purpose of addressing a specific challenge, or they may be directed to the longer-term process of strengthening individual and organisational capacity.

To focus our training and coaching, we distinguish between networks created to:

- Boost innovation and coordinated action in specific clusters of innovation
- Inspire and facilitate institutional change in support of pro-poor innovation, e.g. linking research and education to development

ICRA works for and with both types of networks. In fact, by working on interactive learning in innovation clusters, we learn how to construct institutional arrangements that stimulate knowledge sharing and coordinated action. We can then stimulate advocacy that is inspired by concrete examples on the ground.

ICRA IN SHORT

ICRA, the International Centre for development oriented Research in Agriculture, was founded in 1981 by European members of the Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research (CGIAR), a consortium of countries, donor agencies and other organisations committed to ending hunger, world poverty and environmental decline.

ICRA was established specifically to strengthen the capacity of agricultural researchers to engage in interdisciplinary teamwork, and to collaborate more effectively with other researchers, extension staff and smallholder farmers.

Over the past 30 years, ICRA's focus has widened, and inevitably so, to deal more effectively with the persistent challenge of making research really matter. This evolution has led to:

- The inclusion of research stakeholders (farmers and advisory services) in joint programmes to improve demand articulation for research, collaboration in action research, and knowledge sharing
- The inclusion of higher education staff to develop teaching and outreach programmes that expose students to action-learning and 'real-life' multi-stakeholder processes of innovation.

ICRA is an autonomous, non-profit, internationally operating legal entity, registered in the Netherlands as a foundation under Dutch law. It is governed by an international Board of Trustees.


