Not often does Makerere University Impis chairman Dan Obote take a slap on the cheek lying down but he was left almost disillusioned on Saturday.

MTN Heathens' 75-6 rout of Impis at the latter's own 'graveyard' was the biggest margin in the Nile Special Premier League so far and Obote hardly found his voice thereafter. "It was just a bad game," Obote said before pausing for a while. "Their line is very good. I mean their backline is very organised."

He not only underlined the recent decline of Impis in losing all three games but also the strength of Heathens' backline which forms the crux of the national 7s team.

The champions sent out their loudest signal thus far through tries from backs Michael Wokorach (3), Jonathan Bishop Onen, Jude Keremundu, Brian Kikawa, Jasper Ochan and Evans Kingasia.

Forwards Scot Olouch (2) and Robert Seguya also touched down in an impressive haul of 11 tries.

That was the starter prior to the

annual Kyadondo RFC dinner held on Saturday night.

Heathens are now joint leaders with Utl Kobs on 15 points. The duo has collected three bonus points in all their three games following Kobs' 39-3 win over the former's understudy side Toyota Buffaloes under the Kampala RFC heat in the early game.

Captain Brian Odong (2), Allan Matsiko, Steven Ogwete, Brian Asaba and Justin Kimono all crossed the line with the ball in hand. "I think the whole team defended well with all the young players in the side. We can get better with time if we gel," Matsiko said upon receiving his man-of-the-match award.

Those two results forced G4S Pirates out of their shells to pound Rhino 33-5 thanks to a second half onslaught engineered by Kenyan fly-half Hillary Juma at Kampala. He scored a try to add to Oscar Opio's that cancelled an Andrew Omoding shocker on 20 minutes. Juma set-up prop Martin Karugonjo and hooker Solomon
