## Mwamba put blame on Mak 10s organisers

Mwamba RFC have blamed their withdrawal from the annual Makerere 10s on the organisers' sudden decision to postpone the tournament from this weekend to November 20-21.

In an e-mail addressed to Makerere
University Impis Rugby Club
chairman Dan Obote last Wednesday,
Mwamba asserted their willingness to
take part in the event had it been
played on the earlier scheduled dates.

"This (the change of dates) comes as a shock to us. We have been planning for this tour for close to a year," the email sent by George Mbaye, honorary secretary of Mwamba, read in part.

"As regards to the notice, it's too short for us which means we are out."

When contacted, Obote acknowledged the Kenyans' disappointment and anger but refused to take full responsibility for the changes. "The sponsors requested for the rescheduling in order to position themselves well," the Impis head said.

## National duty

It's now clear that Mwamba are not pulling out due to the Kenya Cup season but rather the inability to field their best side. "On that weekend, 10 of Mwamba's best players will be away in Namibia and Sri Lanka on national duty with the two (national) 7s teams," Mbaye, an alumnus of Makerere University and Mwamba forward, added.

Dennis Ombachi, all of whom are part of Kenya's 7s team.

In the absence of the former champions and finalists on two other occasions, Mean Machine, Nakuru and Blakblad are expected to challenge local clubs for top honours at Makerere grounds, fondly referred to as the graveyard.
