



After 11 games in the Nile Special Rugby Premier League, Makerere University Impis decided to travel to Kenya to feature in the Nakuru 10s which ended on Sunday.

“There was so much fun. The level of competition there will help our side in terms of growth,” Dan Obote, the Impis chairman, told Daily Monitor.

Rodney Turyatamba resumes his captaincy after Richard Tamale took charge in Nakuru where wing Marlon Ondieke starred.

Having run toe-to-toe with champions MTN Heathens, G4S Pirates and utl Kobs, Rhino must capitalise on Impis exhaustion after a 20-hour bus ride across the border and back in a meager three days.

John Musoke's shift from inside center to fly-half has paid dividends with his flawless kicking which has often gained the team territory to rise to fifth on 14 points.

Much as Rhino's scrum is resilient, coach Henry Musoke still ponders with his wingers' ability to execute at the Makerere University home ground.

Action the league continues tomorrow with many matches on card.
