Prof Kajubi burial for Saturday

📄 IN SUMMARY

The academic died on Tuesday at his home in Bugolobi, a Kampala suburb.

KAMPALA

A committee set up to arrange the burial of the late Prof William Ssenteza Kajubi, who passed on at his home in Bugolobi on Tuesday, has said the academic will be laid to rest on Saturday.

Nkumba Vice Chancellor Paul Mugambi, who was chosen to head the committee, said they would bury Kajubi at his ancestral home at Maya off Masaka Road in Mpigi District.

“We hope to hold a requiem mass at Namirembe Cathedral on Friday at 3 o’clock and take the remains of the late Kajubi to Maya on Saturday at 4pm,” he said. He said they are still waiting for the former Makerere University vice-chancellor’s children to arrive from abroad.

Professor Kajubi, also a former Nkumba University vice chancellor, on Tuesday collapsed in his bathroom and died instantly.

Dr Bwogi Kanyerezi, a physician at International Hospital Kampala, also personal doctor to the professor, said it could have been stroke that had attacked him some weeks ago but had steadily recovered and was making good progress.

Prof Kajubi was also a renowned freedom fighter. He will be remembered for championing the ‘no Lule or no work protests’ in early 1980 geared at pressing government accept the return of the late Prof Yusuf Lule to participate in the general elections.

He was the late Ben Kiwanuka’s Principal Personal Secretary and aspired for Mengo North Constituency Member of Parliament seat on the DP ticket in 1964. He was a member the education commission that resulted in the 1970 Education Act and chaired the Education Policy Review Commission, which among other things recommended the introduction of UPE.
