Michael, a student teacher, met a Senior One student in 1981 at Bubulo Girls School in Manafwa. "She was small, but extremely bright," Masanza explains. By coincidence, Masanza taught the girl's favourite science subjects. That girl was Monica, who later became his wife.

"Michael used to teach Chemistry, Biology and Physics, my favourite subjects," she reminisces. At that time, getting married to Michael or any of her teachers was the furthest thing in her mind.

I do not like hurting people. I would like someone to know what he or she is going into. So, I preferred to reveal my character in a write-up, to make him aware of who I was. I knew that since we had had no proper courtship, he would be shocked by my character.

One of the lighter things in the write-up was that I would not know how to iron trousers and frankly, up to now, I do not know how to do it.

## **Parenting**

From an early age, we teach them Christian basics. As a must, we take our children to Christian schools. We also go to church together as a family. We try to involve them in church activities so that they can appreciate our ministry. We believe that when they grow up, they will reflect what we have imparted to them.

My parenting was greatly influenced by my mother. When it comes to parenting, Michael and I complement each other.

From the beginning, we agreed to settle our marital challenges in the bedroom without the children getting wind of anything.

For a long time in our marriage, I earned more money than my husband, but it was never an issue. We both believed that 'what was mine was his' and because of that, I remained submissive to my husband, despite my financial status.

We discuss everything together as a couple. We have strategic plans for every year.

Usually, we go out for a retreat. Initially, he was not in for that, but now, he is the one pushing all the time for our planning sessions. From time to time, we make reviews and assessments.

The only way I can show love back is by allowing her to pursue her aspirations.
