President Museveni Charms Mak Staff and Students

Mak staff and students can now usher in the New Year with hope.

Meeting the Mak delegation at State House on 21st August 2014, President Museveni pledged to increase funding to Mak, increase the remuneration of staff in public universities, and to take over the Mak wage bill in the financial year 2015/2016.

President Museveni reiterated the commitment while addressing thousands of Mak staff and students in the Freedom Square on 12th September 2014.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Ddumba-Ssentamu, welcomed the President's pledge saying it would be a great relief to the University. "Mak contributes 42% per month towards the entire wage bill, which draws resources from other university activities, staff and student welfare. Once the Government takes over the entire wage bill, pressure on increase of fees will be reduced. Fees paid by students would cater for other needs of the university," he said.

A well funded Mak will be able to attract and retain highly



qualified and innovative staff; continue to produce high quality and relevant graduates; undertake competitive research and innovations; improve staff and student welfare as well as service delivery.

- Possible areas of research on the effect of dust on livestock and insects found in arid land farming areas in East Africa; dust on human health; dust from smoke in factories/industries.
- Mechanical engineering students to do practical training/ internship at the Innovations Centre.
- Introduction of Japanese language studies.

Makerere wins big at TechCon 2014

The Higher Education Solutions Network (HESN) second annual technical convening, TechCon 2014 held on November 8-10, at the University of California Berkeley, USA, showcased over 40 innovations from USAID's HESN Development Labs (www.usaid.gov/hesn) and partners.

The Makerere University team was led by Prof. Barnabas Nawangwe, the Deputy Vice Chancellor in charge of Finance and Administration and Resilient Africa Network (RAN) Patron.

"Innovation is the way to go and Makerere University has been committed to supporting and nurturing innovations

since 1922, the ball is in your courts to make use of available opportunities to develop solutions for the most pressing challenges," he said as he challenged student innovators drawn from across the Resilient Africa Network.

The climax of TechCon 2014 was an Innovation Marketplace that showcased innovations from University students and start-ups addressing Global Development challenges.

Eight teams of innovators from Makerere University-RAN (www.ranlab.org) with projects in the domains of Agriculture, Health and Engineering participated in the Innovation Marketplace,

competing with thirty seven other projects from the US.

One of the projects from Makerere University College of Veterinary Medicine, Animal Resources and Bio-Security titled; **Hydroponic Fodder Production for Livestock**, emerged amongst the top three winners and the best project from the HESN Universities, evidence of the global potential and competitiveness of the locally developed solutions.
