

# Guidelines for In-Country/In-Region Scholarships, Eastern Africa – 2015/16

# 1) Timeline

Thursday, April 30 <sup>th</sup> , 2015	Weblinks to scholarship advertisement(s) as well as name, Email ad- dress/phone number of contact person for applicants to be sent to DAAD (bonface@daadafrica.org)
Friday, June 19th, 2015	Scholarship candidate shortlists, containing twice as many candidates as scholarships on offer, to be sent to DAAD ( <u>bonface@daadafrica.org</u> )
	For PhD candidates, <b>results of plagiarism tests</b> of the respective PhD proposals must be attached.
July 2015	Final selection of scholarship candidates by DAAD
September 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2015	Earliest starting date of funding

### 2) General Guidelines and Procedures

- Scholarship advertisements are to be prepared by the university/network/research centre in accordance with the following DAAD guidelines.
- The advertisement(s) must contain the DAAD logo
- The weblink to the scholarship advertisement(s) as well as the name and Email address/phone number of a contact person for applicants must be send to DAAD (<u>bonface@daadafrica.org</u>) by Thursday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015.
- DAAD will publish a list of all programmes/institutions eligible for In-Country/In-Region Scholarships in Eastern Africa on its website, containing the names of programmes/institutions and weblinks to the respective advertisements/contact persons.
- Applicants must send their application files directly to the university/network/research centre. In addition, they must send a complete soft copy to DAAD (<u>applications@daadafrica.org</u>)
- In addition to any application documents requested by the university/network/research centre, all applicants are requested to send in the filled DAAD Application form and other documents listed below (cf. section 3a).
- Deadlines for individual applications are to be set by the university/network/research centre, taking into account that candidate shortlists must be sent to DAAD not later than Friday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2015.
- Following the respective deadline for individual applications, the university/network/research centre will carry out preselections among the applicants, taking into consideration DAAD requirements listed below (cf. section 3). PhD proposals must be scanned for plagiarism by the university/network/research centre.
- DAAD expects that, unless the application situation makes it impossible, at least half of the shortlisted candidates are female and 1/3 of the shortlisted candidates come from other institutions/countries. Shortlists should also reflect diversity with regards to, e.g., regional/social background.
- Candidate shortlists in priority order must be sent to DAAD (<u>bonface@daadafrica.org</u>) by Friday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2015. They should contain twice as many candidates as scholarships on offer. For PhD candidates, results of plagiarism tests of the respective PhD proposals must be attached.
- The final selection of scholarship holders will be carried out by a selection committee nominated by DAAD in July 2015.
- The earliest starting date for funding is September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015.

# 3) Information and Documents to be included in the Scholarship Advertisement

- a) The following information must be included in each scholarship advertisement:
- List of eligible programmes/study fields: It must be clearly indicated that only those programmes/study fields which are stated in the DAAD Letter of Offer are eligible for scholarships.
- *Relevance to development:* PhD proposals must demonstrate relevance to development.
- Duration and commencement.
  Scholarships are available for up to a maximum of two years (Master) and three years (PhD) respectively. The scholarship will be initially granted for one year and may be extended upon individual request and receipt of a complete application by using the provided form.
- Equal opportunities: Female candidates and candidates from less privileged regions or groups as well as candidates with disabilities are especially encouraged to apply.
- Application Procedure and Deadline
   Applications must be sent to the respective host institution. In addition, a complete soft copy
   must be sent to DAAD (applications@daadafrica.org), containing
  - o the application documents requested by the host institution, as well as
  - o the filled *DAAD Application Form* and
  - o all additional documents requested by the *DAAD Information Sheet for Scholars*.
- b) The following **documents** must be attached to each scholarship advertisement:
  - DAAD Application Form
  - DAAD Information Sheet for Students

### 4) Financial administration of Scholarships

• Depending on bilateral agreements, the scholarship funds will either be paid out by the DAAD Regional Office Nairobi, the host institution, or the German Embassy in the host country.
