Background:

Because of the increasing trend in diseases that result from animal-human-environment interactions, there is a new global paradigm of doing things together to solve health challenges. Multidisciplinary individuals with transformative knowledge and ability to prevent and mitigate risks at the animal-human-ecosystems interface are needed in order to achieve "One Health"

- Undergraduate Makerere University students who are currently in their final semester and those who hope to have completed by 2016 from any of the fields of: Social Sciences, Public Health, Mass communication, IT, Veterinary, Nursing, Law, Human Medicine, Agriculture, Environment, businness and Laboratory Sciences
- Fluent in English communication (listening, speaking, writing, and understanding).
- Have a letter of recommendation from hisacademic supervisor.
- Fully available for theoretical training and placement period (10th April- 31st May 2016).
