Technical specifications:

- Video length: 3 5 Minutes.
- Video size: any size, as long as it fits within the first stipulation.

Submitting the Video:

For simplicity, we suggest you upload this video or multimedia presentation to Vimeo or YouTube and submit the link. However, we will accept any link which we can access. If your link is password-protected, please share it with us at the time of submission.

Category 2: Photo Contest

As the saying goes, "**A picture is worth a thousand words**". Help us tell the story of your project, your activities and community engagement, your accomplishments in transforming the lives of the population in the communities with a photo.

Photo Requirements: Please send us the highest resolution version of the photo you have. High quality JPG and JPEG. Picture resolution: should be 2MP [1,600 x 1,200] or better. **Photos must each be an original submission**. Photos must each include a credit: name of photographer and organizational affiliation (where applicable). Photos must each include a **unique caption**, which includes a description of what is going on in the photo, who is involved, where it was taken, and the challenge you are solving. Generally Photos should "*tell the story and tell it loud*".

Awards

Brief Overview of RAN

The Resilient Africa Network (RAN) funded by USAID is a partnership targeting 20 universities in 16 African countries. The main agenda of RAN is to strengthen resilience of communities

vulnerable to shocks and stresses in Sub-Saharan Africa through university led-local African innovative solutions. The Network is led by Makerere University, School of Public Health and is one of the eight global development labs under the Higher Education solutions Network (HESN) - <u>www.usaid.gov/hesn</u>. The core partners are; Tulane University's Disaster Resilience Leadership Academy (DRLA), Stanford University and the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS); (<u>http://www.ranlab.org</u>). RAN constitutes of 4 Resilience Innovation Labs (RILabs) each working with Network plus Universities and focusing on different thematic areas as summarized in the figure below;

The Eastern Africa RILab located in Uganda examines community resilience in the face of chronic conflict and displacement. It also examines climate change and variability – governance challenges and communities' ability to adapt. Partner universities are in Democratic Republic of Congo, Rwanda, Tanzania, and Uganda.

The Horn of Africa RILab located in Ethiopia examines the impact of drought and chronic displacement on local communities and regional dynamics. Partners include universities in Ethiopia, Kenya, and Somalia. The West Africa RILab based in Ghana focuses on population growth and urbanization, from fast-growing cities and low-income settlements to refugee camps, working to understand local adaptive capacities. The lab has partnered with universities in Mali and Senegal.

The Southern Africa RILab based in South Africa concentrates on the impact of chronic disease, especially HIV/AIDS, on access to livelihood assets and understanding local adaptive strategies. Partner universities are in South Africa, Malawi, and Zimbabwe.
