1. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

It is my honour and privilege to welcome you all to the 68th graduation ceremony of Makerere University. It is with great pleasure that I welcome you all as the 11th Vice Chancellor of Makerere University on this second session of the 68th Graduation ceremony. Mr. Chancellor Sir, this is a historical occasion being the first graduation under my new leadership.

I would like to thank God for His Grace and Benevolence, His Excellency President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, the First Lady and Minister of Education and Sports, Hon. Janet Kataaha Museveni, the Chancellor, Chairman and Members of the University Council, members of the Senate, the Search Committee for the Vice Chancellor and the entire University Community for the opportunity given to me to serve as the 11th Vice Chancellor of this Great Institution. With God on our side, we will, as the University Community, work with all stakeholders to further uplift the image of this great Institution that is currently ranked among the top Universities in the world. Let me take this opportunity to thank H.E. The President for honouring me and eight other members of the University Community with the Independence Golden Jubilee medal, the highest honour bestowed on a non Head of State. The others honoured are the Chairman of Council, Eng. Dr. Charles Wana-Etyem, Professors Edward Kirumira, Murindwa Rutanga, Anthony Mugisha, Eria Hisali, Oswald Ndoleriire, Elly Sabiiti and Peter Baguma.

I take this opportunity to thank the former Vice Chancellor, Prof. John Ddumba Ssentamu, for his dedicated service to the University over the last five years and wish him well in his future career endeavours.

The University has this past year lost many students, members of staff, their spouses, children, parents and relatives. I wish to extend my condolences to all those that lost their loved ones. May the Lord rest their souls in peace. I also wish to extend our condolences to the Church of Uganda for the loss of Archbishop Livingstone Mpalanyi Nkoyoyo. We celebrate his life and service to the Lord. To Uganda Christian University Mukono, we commiserate with you for the loss of your first Chancellor. Please accept our heartfelt condolences.

Ladies and gentlemen, for this 68th graduation ceremony, a total of **14,085** students will be awarded degrees and diplomas of Makerere University in various disciplines. Of these, **71** will receive PhDs, **996** Masters Degrees, **96** Postgraduate Diplomas, **144** undergraduate diplomas and **12,778** Bachelors Degrees. Of these, **7,118** (50.5%) are female and **6,967** (49.5%) are male. I am happy to see that all our policies to promote access to higher education for the girl child are bearing fruit and that we remain the leaders in gender mainstreaming on the African Continent.

Honorary Degree to Mrs. Winnie Madikizela Mandela

During this congregation on Friday 19th January 2018, Mrs. Winnie Madikizela Mandela will receive an Honorary Doctorate of Laws of Makerere University in recognition of her outstanding contribution to the liberation struggle of South Africa and Africa at large. The decision to award Mrs. Mandela an Honorary Doctorate successfully went through all the vetting procedures following her successful nomination. I warmly congratulate Mrs. Winnie Madikizela Mandela upon this achievement and welcome her to Makerere University Convocation.

I applaud all members of staff who will be awarded PhDs and Masters degrees in various disciplines. Your dedication to improving yourselves academically as well as our students is commendable. I am certain this will boost the Makerere University academic profile. I also take this opportunity to congratulate all members of staff who have been promoted to various academic levels in the last one year.

I would like to thank the Government of Uganda and our development partners who have supported us through the years. Our distinguished guests, I have the pleasure to inform you that last year we signed six memoranda of Understanding with international partners with the view to further internationalise the University and tap into the expertise of various institutions and organizations across the globe. We welcome more development partners to support us in further strengthening teaching and learning as well as research and innovation.

2. ACHIEVEMENTS 2016/17 ACADEMIC YEAR

Ladies and gentlemen, Makerere University has registered a number of achievements over the last one year.

In Research and Innovation, many new innovations were recorded arising out of research in various colleges and Makerere University remained highly ranked in research productivity. It is against this background that Makerere University won two World Bank Grants worth \$12 million for two Centres of Excellence, one to be hosted in the College of Engineering, Design, Art and Technology (CEDAT) and another at the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CAES). CEDAT will host the Africa Center of Excellence in Materials Product Development and Nanotechnology (MAPRONANO). CAES will host the Centre for Crop Improvement. The University had also applied to host three additional centres of excellence in the areas of Oil & Gas, ICT & Engineering and Biomedical Sciences. The bids were approved, but not funded. I call upon the Government of Uganda to support the University in this endeavour.

Infrastructure Development remains a major area of concern for our University. We have benefitted from the AfDB-HEST funded project through a loan to the Government of Uganda. Two central teaching facilities, with a total area of 12,000 square metres have been built and a number of laboratories in five colleges have been renovated and up-graded under this funding. Under the MOU between Makerere University and KCCA for compensation for land taken up for the expansion of Makerere Hill Road, re-construction of all our major roads has been completed. These infrastructure developments have greatly transformed the University's landscape. Street Lighting has also been installed on all major roads in the University and this has led to an improvement in security.

University Management has embarked on renovation of the sports facilities in the University and improvement of sanitation facilities in the Halls of Residence and colleges.

During last year's graduation ceremony, Makerere University Convocation launched a fundraising drive for the construction of a perimeter wall. I am now happy to report that construction of the perimeter wall has commenced. The entire project is estimated to cost UGX7.5billion. So far, UGX 250 million has been raised through generous contributions of staff, alumni, parents, students, corporate organisation and friends of Makerere University. This generous contribution has been used to construct 600 metres of the 6 kilometer fence, which would have ordinarily cost at least UGX 750

million through contracting. I call upon all well-wishers to contribute to the project. We are hopeful that once completed, security at Campus will greatly improve. I thank the leadership of Convocation for spearheading this project.

Our distinguished guests, on 5th December 2017, Makerere University held her first ever property investment conference, with the aim of attracting investments on her prime land using the Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode. The interest from investors was enormous and we are now working on solicitation of proposals for specific projects. Among the projects lined up under this arrangement are a three star hotel and convention centre on main campus, student hostels on main campus, five star hotel, upper market apartments and office park at Kololo, upper and middle income apartments in Kololo, teaching hospital in Katalemwa, and others. When completed, these projects will greatly contribute to the University's revenue.

Makerere University Run (MakRun 2018)

As one of the strategies to raise funds for the University, the Makerere University Endowment Fund (MakEF) –was established in 2014. MakEF under its mandate to achieve long term financial sustainability for the University started the MakRun. I thank all those who participated in last year's Run where we collected Ushs247,845,000 (two hundred forty seven million eight hundred forty five thousand Uganda Shillings).

The MakRun is an annual event, mainly aimed at supporting the Fund's inaugural project, the "**Students Centre**". The estimated cost for the construction of the centre is UGX15billion. I call upon everyone present here today to support this noble cause. Ladies and gentlemen, please warm up and get ready to participate in the MakRun 2018 scheduled on Sunday 25th March 2018.

Timely Processing of Makerere University Academic Transcripts:

To ease service delivery, the University Central Management has decentralized the issuance of Makerere University academic transcripts. I am happy to report that all students that have fulfilled all the requirements for graduation can now pick their transcripts from their respective College Registrars.

Cordial Student-Management relations:

The University Management continues to work closely with student leaders to improve relations between the two bodies in an effort to reduce strikes, hooliganism and also open channels of communication. Hooliganism has no place in Africa's premier university and we all must fight it.

Makerere University Students Disciplinary Committee:

The University recently constituted the student Disciplinary Committee, which will hear cases of indiscipline. I urge all our students to read and internalize the rules and regulations of the University and avoid the possibility of appearing before the Disciplinary Committee.

Improving Student Welfare:

In an effort to improve student welfare, the University Management has established a forum which brings together owners of private student hostels. This is intended to improve security and living conditions of our students. We have embarked on an ambitious plan to improve conditions in halls of residence and build new modern hostels on campus.

Appeal to Support the 3rd FISU World University Netball Championship 2018:

Ladies and gentlemen, in spite of all these achievements, we still have a lot to do to further improve our University. Every effort is being made to re-develop the dilapidated sports facilities at the University. Ultimately, the goal is to re-develop the Main Sports Grounds into a multi-purpose stadium, starting with an indoor stadium to accommodate the 3rd FISU World University Netball Championship, which Makerere University will host on behalf of Uganda in September 2018. We are currently fund-raising for this very important facility and I call upon all our stakeholders to extend their support to the project.

The Mak Visitation Committee Report:

The University Officials recently witnessed the handover of the Visitation Committee report to H.E President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni. We have instituted a committee to study the recommendations and provide feedback. This feedback will feed into the Government White Paper. The University Management will in the meantime implement some of the immediate recommendations.

Introduction of Centralized Marking Approach:

To curb the vice of late submission of student results, the University has adopted a policy of centralized marking. Each College will have a room where scripts are kept and lecturers will be required to mark in that room and leave all scripts there. This will help reduce delays in submission of results and also minimize loss of student scripts.

MasterCard Foundation Scholars Program First Cohort Graduating:

I take this opportunity to congratulate the first cohort Scholars of Mastercard Foundation who are graduating today. Mr. Chancellor Sir, you recall that in 2013, Makerere University entered into a partnership with Mastercard Foundation to educate 1000 academically bright but economically disadvantaged youth of Africa, to study at Makerere University for the next 10 years. I am therefore delighted to inform you that **28 first cohort Scholars** are graduating during the 68th graduation ceremony. One of whom, Claire Muga Akinyi is graduating with First class Honours degree in Community Psychology. It is gratifying because the program gives hope to students from all socioeconomic backgrounds to attain university education. We thank the Mastercard Foundation for the support to the future leaders of Africa. As Makerere University continues to benefit from the generosity of partnerships such as Mastercard Foundation, it is important to support and create a conducive environment for such initiatives and partnerships to thrive.

Makerere University Female Scholarship Foundation (FSF) Presenting Graduands:

This year, under the stewardship of the Gender Mainstreaming Directorate, 144 female scholars of the Female Scholarship Foundation are graduating, including 04 first class and 63 second class upper degrees. These are part of the 1,020 bright but socio-economically disadvantaged females that have been supported to study in various Colleges at the University since 2001. Of the 1,020 females, 74 have been directly financed by Makerere University through a tuition waiver scheme.

I pay special tribute to the organizations that have supported the Gender Mainstreaming Directorate in this regard. These include Carnegie Corporation of New York, the Swedish Government (SIDA), Norwegian Government, African Development Bank, Uganda Association of Women Lawyers

(FIDA-Uganda), MS JD Global Education Fund, DFCU Bank, Joshua Mugyenyi Foundation, among others. I call upon well-wishers to support the noble cause of assisting those disadvantaged socially and economically to access University Education.

First Graduates of Chinese Language

During this congregation on Friday 19th January 2018, we will graduate the first cohort of students who have studied the Chinese Language. This is landmark achievement in the building of good relations between the people of Uganda and the people of China. I urge more Ugandans to take interest in Chinese, the language spoken by the largest number of people in the World.

3. ACHIEVEMENTS AT COLLEGES

Today, a total of **4,288** graduands from the Colleges of Business and Management Sciences (CoBAMS), Computing and Information Sciences (CoCIS), Health Sciences (CHS) and Veterinary Medicine, Animal Resources and Biosecurity (CoVAB) will be conferred upon degrees and receive certificates of Makerere University.

I commend the **College of Computing and Information Sciences** for coming up with research projects namely: Epidemiology intervention without Location – a Blind Guess by Augustus Aturinde, HingiCredit - A Big Data Driven Credit Risk Analysis System for Ugandan Farmers by Grace Kamulegeya, and A GIS Based Predictive Model for Prevalence of Infectious Diseases in Sub-Saharan Africa: Case Study of Cholera by Nagwovuma Margaret, Through these interventions, CoCIS has demonstrated that Makerere remains committed to impacting our communities through innovations that impact two of Africa's most important sectors; health and agriculture.

I commend the college under its community outreach initiative for organising the **Get Connected Training** to impart ICT skills to P.7, S.4 and S.6 vacationers in the Makerere Community. I also commend researchers in CoCIS led by Dr. Engineer Bainomugisha for partnering with the University of Sheffield to develop low-cost air monitoring devices to measure air quality. The team has innovatively deployed a network of air quality monitors on *boda-bodas* and streetlights and buildings in selected areas of Kampala city in partnership with KCCA to produce a detailed and near real-time air pollution map.

The College of Veterinary Medicine, Animal Resources and Bio-security (CoVAB) is committed to advancing science and technology while nurturing citizens to become productive, entrepreneurial, job creators, skilled and with sufficient capacity to transform the existing challenges in the animal resources world into economic and livelihood opportunities.

In 2017 CoVAB scientists secured 3 Billion Uganda Shillings from Uganda Government and International partners to fund the generation of technologies, innovations and services on the following areas. The development of anti-tick and east coast fever vaccines, development of a diagnostic Kit for sleeping sickness and brucellosis, establishment of ultra-modern fish and

animal feed factory at Nakyesasa Industrial Research incubation center, development of an antimycotoxin binder, skilling of 500 farmers and establishment of farm enterprises.

The College of Health Sciences remains the flagship college for our research. Through the Makerere Lung Institute, the college is conducting high quality lung health research that integrates disease prevention, clinical care and training in sub-Saharan Africa. I commend CHS for coming up with courses on Respiratory Medicine for primary care health workers, with the first course on asthma set to run from 19th to 23rd February 2018. I equally commend the ResilientAfrica Network (RAN), School of Public Health for partnering with Uganda Development Bank Limited (UDBL) to launch the **i-Growth Accelerator 2017**. This annual initiative will foster Innovation and entrepreneurship by supporting individuals to grow and expand their outstanding start-up enterprises in all sectors through recognition, promotion, reward, incubation and acceleration.

Through rigorous community engagement and research, we now pride in having nurtured and developed some tested potentially transformative innovations. These are currently being incubated at the Makerere University RAN Innovation Lab and they include; a winnowing Maize Thresher being used by farmer groups in South Western Uganda in Masindi, Hoima and Nakasongola, a retrofit able Pedal Tap currently in use in most of the Kampala City County Authority offices, the Solar Irrigation Pump helping farmers in Pallisa, Kasese and Wakiso districts realize yields even in dry seasons when we do not have enough rains and the Solar Dryer enhancing farmer export earnings since they are now able to dry all Agricultural produce including; Pineapples, Pumpkins, fruits, vegetables and other different food stuffs retaining the food aroma, color, food nutrients and quality too. The solar dryer is also currently being used mainly by women groups in central Kampala region to dry briquettes and improve on their wellbeing.

Focusing on moving Universities to communities and putting into proper use knowledge generated at the Universities, RAN has built a portfolio of 200 micro-projects including 36 potentially scalable public health technologies that target low income countries. We now have 24 start-up companies and if we continue with this vigor, indeed we would all further realize and reap from the rich entrepreneurship skills in Uganda. I am also proud to serve as the RAN Patron given that we all usually want to identify with such successful initiatives.

The College of Health Sciences in collaboration with St. Augustine International University carried out a fundraising dinner for a Local Research Fund for non-communicable diseases and raised **Ug.Shs.652,000,000** to be launched by the H. E. the President of the Republic of Uganda on 12th February, 2018 as he Officially opens the Symposium.

The College of Business and Management Sciences (CoBAMS) continues to partner with organisations such as the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) Uganda and the Certified Public Accountants of Uganda CPA (U) to not only offer professional courses that train and produce professional accountants but also high quality graduates. I congratulate the

college upon consistently producing the overall best MA Economics students in the Joint Facility for Electives (JFE) Examination results over last two years.

I also commend the Department of Accounting for preparing our students for the Ethics Challenge and the CFA Institute Research Challenge both organised by the Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) Institute of Uganda. Our students consistently return with top honours in these competitions. I equally commend CoBAMS for partnering with Operation Wealth Creation (OWC) and other partners to promote entrepreneurship skills among our students.

4. CONCLUSION

In conclusion, I wish to state that Makerere is a great university by any standards. But Makerere can and will become even greater and more relevant to our Country. In order to achieve that, we must uphold our professional integrity as staff and the students must exercise maximum discipline. Uganda has made enormous sacrifices and invested in us, we must give back to our dear motherland in double measure. I wish to once again make this solemn promise: That I will endeavor to execute the authority entrusted to me with maximum transparency and absolute humility, in order to provide much needed leadership to my large team of more than 5000 employees, so that TOGETHER, we can lift Makerere to the epitome of academic excellence and make Uganda proud, God being my guide.

5. A WORD TO THE GRADUANDS

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Finally I turn to you our dear graduands. I congratulate all of you and your parents, guardians and sponsors upon this noble achievement. The time and resources you have invested have paid off and that is the cause for our celebration today. Allow me to specifically thank our dear parents, guardians and sponsors who have selflessly financed your studies to this level. They have sacrificed a lot to give you a good future and deserve to be appreciated. Please join me in expressing our gratitude by giving them a thunderous round of applause.

You are going out to the world, which expects a lot from you. We have trained you to be critical thinkers and not mere job seekers. Go out and create the jobs the Country is yearning for. With a degree from one of the best universities in the world, there is no reason for not succeeding. As you struggle to find your place in society, you might stumble and fall, but always have the courage to stand up and try again with dignity. Your success is our pride. Avoid vain ambitions and keep away from corruption. Love and respect your parents and God will open doors for you. As you go through the gates of Makerere, hold your head high and always hold your alma mater in high esteem. And please, do not forget the gates of Makerere. God Bless You All!
