

FOOD INSECURITY



Am talking of postharvest losses (PHLs) topping \$48billion each year, exceeding the \$35billion spent on imports. Implying that reversing these losses will inject \$83billion into the regional economy every year. Right here, Uganda's PHLs amount to nearly \$5 million annually. Reversing means injecting an extra UGS 16bn to the local economy.



Africans are in extreme poverty.



Because when we go further and decentralize electricity to power agro-industrialization, we get a much higher return

Am talking of energy poverty, with over 600million – over 60% of the continents population being in the dark. Yet just 0.3% of the sunlight we have here, can supply nearly all of Europe's energy needs. Am talking of as much as \$98billion extra just from one crop value chain, translating to not only lighted houses, but jobs & richer communities and bigger economies.



Climate change is already defining the contours of the continent - representing an ever-increasing threat projected to impact agro-productivity in ways that we have never seen before.

The majority of Africa's population is youthful and up to 60% of them are unemployed. By 2035, the number of Africans reaching working age will exceed the rest of the world combined.



CLEAN ENERGY FOR PROCESSING AND OTHER COMMERCIAL AGRO-VALUE CHAIN LINKAGES



Where we focus our collective resources to linking sustainable Ecosystem-based adaptation (EbA) driven agriculture to clean energy based value addition, It will reverse ecosystems degradation and enhance retrieval of the \$68bn lost annually to land degradation. This integration is projected to potentially create as many as 17 million jobs along the entire agro-value chain, earn an additional \$20bn annually from agro-trade.

Post-Harvest Loses are estimated 25 – 35% with other estimates pegging losses at a high of 60%





losses in fruits – mangoes, pawpaw & oranges are at a high of 80%.



Banana, the most important staple crop registers up to 45% PHLs. Cumulatively Uganda's annual PHLs are estimated at nearly \$34 million annually. Translating to not only lost food, but income & job opportunities along the supply chain.



Cassava, the second most important staple crop in Uganda & identified as an emerging market oriented commodity has the most significant losses of up to 90% of its initial value – translating to over \$30 million annually



POCKETS OF SUCCESS AND MOVE FROM TALK TO ACTION




In the Democratic Republic of Congo, a group of graduate youthful "agripreneurs" have channeled their skills, networks and capital to optimize the cassava value chain. These young people process cassava into flour, package it, standardize it and sell to bakers. For this integration, the youth generate up to \$4,000 as weekly income, translating to \$16,000 monthly and \$196,000 annual income.




In Nigeria through the EBAFOSA Framework premised on the spirit of innovative volunteerism mobilized youth groups have volunteered their skills and partner with farmer cooperatives with the aim of developing EbA farming and expanding reach of EbA actions in Nigeria.




ON POLICY HARMONIZATION



EBAFOSA Sierra Leone task force has started building on some 4 ongoing policy initiatives for harmonization towards maximizing productivity of the catalytic areas.



Through the EBAFOSA standards currently being domesticated in Uganda, the cassava producers of Busiro will have a market beyond the Uganda Breweries initiative. Their market will extend across the 17 Buganda counties, Uganda, your East Africa neighbors and cover 40 countries across Africa. That will put Buganda and Uganda on track to tap into the \$200 million African cassava market.



ICT as a driver, the EBAFOSA driven ICT app called M-eBAFOSA currently been developed in Nigeria and across EBAFOSA countries will be a one-stop-shop financing module, a door-way that links diverse actors. M-eBAFOSA is bringing an added value novelty- expanding a new layer covering strategic level data needs for policy & non policy investment decisions makers.





The formula to engendering an inclusive Africa and ensuring collective progress and prosperity is on the move. Such pockets of success are a clarion call and an encouragement for us to build on them and create full scale solutions.


A difference like that been made by Muhammed Taal in the Gambia who after years 14 years in Europe doing different jobs to survived returned back home in 2000. He tried to use his skills to build up his assets by starting composition production. Through EBAFOSA, he has partnered with livestock farmers to harvest manure & groundnut farmers to harvest shells and using these as raw material, produce bio-fertilizer for sell.



It's a story of young St Kizito High School in Uganda who are developing practical skills in briquette production, EBA & smart agriculture and waste management but is also supplementing technical skills with the Business / Entrepreneurial training. This initiative successfully transformed St, Kizito High School, from use of firewood to use of their fuel briquettes saving up to 7 trucks of firewood per term and 21 trucks per year. This youth are the future of tomorrow
