Strategic decisions 1&2 eligible/competitive

#1 – are you ELIGIBLE?

- Are you a registered public or private institution from an eligible participating country?
- Do you have at least a 3-year record in the formulation and/or implementation of research activities in Africa?
- Are they within the priority topics?

If this is YES, YES – continue to number 2

2 – are you COMPETITIVE ENOUGH?

- Are you regionally competitive within one or more of the priority topics?
- Do you have the people on the ground (Faculty...) to do the leg work?
- Are you willing to co-operate and accept each other mechanisms?

If this is YES, YES, YES – you are good to go!

If you have a single NO on this slide, you should not opt to submit a proposal!

Strategic decisions 3&4 – if running

Once you have decided to compete for a research grant:

- #3 how to RUN the internal process?
- Top down with managers setting priorities?
- Bottom-up with departments / units setting priorities
 - If bottom-up, will there be an internal M&E process?
 - If so, how will it run (criteria, internal/external experts, deadlines...)?
- # 4 how much to INVEST? (staff time and funds)
- How many resources will you (the organisation) invest?
 - What makes department / unit eligible to tap into these resources?
 - What are the procedures to follow to get the resources?
 - How is priority made if there are more needs than resources?

Strategic decisions 5&6 – if not running

Once you have decided NOT to join the partnership:

5 – do you want to be an ASSOCIATED PARTNER?

- Are you regionally relevant within one or more of the priority topics?
- Do you have the people on the ground who are interested and committed?

If YES, YES continue to question 4


6 – WHOM to associate with ?

- Which institution(s) that you have existing relationships with is the 'best bet' for co-operation within your priority topic(s)?
- Why would you associate with them what do you expect to gain?
- Why should they associate with you what is your competitive advantages?

Set the right proposal writing team

- ✓ Strong visionary leader / proposal manager
- √ 1 2 young (mentally) energetic members from relevant department / unit in-house
- √ 3 5 Key partners (idea sharing, synergy, complementarity, relevance, manageable)
- ✓ Good proposal writer (might be available among the persons above)
- ✓ Good editor (neutral person not involved in the drafting)
- ✓ Invest Allocate time and resources

STAKEHOLDER ANALYSIS


A systematic collection and analysis of qualitative information to determine the interests and influence of different individuals, groups and organisations in the formulation and implementation of the project. Basic stakeholder analysis identifies key partners for planning and decision-making as well as stakeholders that need to be consulted and kept informed during the project formulation and implementation.

RESEARCH PROBLEM

- Clear and precise, researchable (operational and measurable), what is already known (literature and other information), identification of what would be studied, Identification of an overarching question or small set of questions, identification of key concepts and terms, articulation of boundaries, importance-benefits-justification, 'jargon'.
- What are the major factors (socio-economic, cultural, programmatic, technological, managerial...) that may contribute to the problem.

Institutional Sustainability

An institution should be deemed sustainable if it has the strength to survive and develop to fulfil its functions on a permanent basis with decreasing levels of external support.

More specifically, one would consider an institution or a longterm project to be sustainable if it were likely to be able :

- to secure necessary inputs and support;
- to provide, efficiently and effectively, a continuing stream of activities and outputs
 - that are valued by its stakeholders (members, clients, and/or superiors);
 - for as long as the institution is needed.

Partnership

Forming an eligible partnership must be based on:

- A sound project idea
- **▶** A real need for synergy and complementarity
- A selection of relevant partners
- An optimum number of partners, i.e. a partnership that combines all the required competences, where each partner has a well-defined role and where partners share project activities and benefits in a balanced way

Role of partners

- What do you as Applicant expect from each partner?
- What can be expected from the Applicant?
- How/to what degree will the Applicant involve the Partners in decision making?
- Are all Partners represented in the project governing body / management team / ...?
- Will all Partners be invited to the annual meetings and how will the cost be covered?
- Can Associates and other stakeholders participate in (annual) meeting as observers at their own cost?
