RE: ACCOMMODATION GUIDELINES

1. ATTACHEMENT TO HALLS OF RESIDENCE

All undergraduate students shall be attached to a Hall of Residence as part of their identity. This DOES NOT AUTOMATICALLY ENTITLE A STUDENT TO BED SPACE IN THE HALLS OF ATTACHMENT INDICATED ON THEIR ADMISSION LETTER.

2. GOVERNMENT SPONSORED STUDENTS

(a) Automatic Accommodation

All students admitted through the Direct Entry Scheme to the study programmes listed below may **be accommodated** in the Halls of Residence to which they are attached as indicated on the admission letter, subject to availability of bed space. Eligible students, who for very strong reasons, are **not able to take up the accommodation offered to them** should inform the Dean of Students in writing before close of business on Monday 10th January, 2022. They should take the information to Room 214, Senate Building.

3. CHANGE OF HALLS OF ATTACHEMENT:

4. PRIVATELY SPONSORED STUDENTS:

- a) All Privately-sponsored students are admitted as Non-Residents. Only those who apply to the Dean of Students for accommodation space and able to pay for it become residents.
- b) Once admitted, students interested in accommodation should apply for bed space to Dean of Students in Room 214, Senate Building. They should present an application letter, a copy of the birth certificate and a school identity card. Successful applicants shall be required to pay accommodation fees to the University before taking up accommodation at their Hall of attachment.
- c) Privately-sponsored students granted permission to reside in Halls of Residence may pay for meals at the nearest Food Court. Information about food providers shall be availed at Halls of Residence by the office of the Warden.
- d) Students admitted to EXTERNAL PROGRAMMES are not eligible for accommodation in the Halls of Residence and so should not apply. They may be accommodated only during face to face and/ or examination sessions, subject to availability of bed space and payment of a fee.
