







































1. Support for the SDGs

 - Financing for Development










SDG Index – Uganda Dashboards

world



SDSN Uganda

The SDSN Uganda National Network

- Approved by the Networks Strategy Council of the UN SDSN – Nov. 2019
- Appointed Makerere University to host the national network
- Launched in April 2021
- Coordinated under College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CAES), Makerere University
- Secretariat in Makerere University Centre for Climate Change Research and Innovations (MUCCRI)

- 5. Support a vibrant SDSN Youth Network in Uganda








1. Building awareness of the SDGs

- Supporting SDSN in production and disseminate SDG reports, global African SDGs index reports
 - SDSN has led thinking on the SDGs with the reports
- Delivery short term and professional trainings in member universities
- Supporting participation in online education e.g. massive open online courses –MOOCs – through the SDG Academy
- Supporting experiential learning









2. Research on sustainable solutions

 The network will promote multi-disciplinary research that will generate evidence-based solutions for enhancing the achievement of SDGs at the national and local levels.







3. Partnerships and multi-stakeholder dialogues

- Create platforms for building partnerships and dialogues.
- Platforms will create thinking spaces for academia, think tanks, government, researchers, private sector, business and civil society
- Work closely with GoU the SDGs Secretariat at OPM to mobilize action







4. Support dialogues and provide devise policy and decision-makers

Offer evidence-based advice to decision-makers engaged in politics, government, business and society to fill SDG policy gaps and motivate positive change towards implementation and achievement of SDGs.







5. Youth empowerment – SDSN Youth

- Will have a youth wing, the SDSN Uganda Youth
- Empowering the youth to create sustainable solutions that address development challenges.
- Youth Wing will focus on:
 - Educating young people about the SDGs and create pathways
 - Connecting young people to global networks to collaborate to achieve the SDGs in Uganda
 - Supporting young people in developing and scaling innovative solutions for the SDGs

- 1. Agriculture and food systems, in support ending poverty and hunger (SGDs 1 & 2)
- 2. Improved Health SDG 3
- 3. Natural resources and ecosystem health: SDG 6 (water and sanitation) and SDG15 (life on land),
- 4. Renewable energy and energy efficiency: to end energy poverty SDG7 affordable and clean energy.
- Sustainable Cities: Inclusive, Resilient, and Connected (SDG 11
- 6. Climate compatible development (SDG 13)
- 7. Gender equality responsiveness (SDG 5) cross cutting

Makerere University Sustainable Development Report (SDR)

Purpose of the Makerere University SDR

To produce a SDR that:

- Positions MAK as a leader in the Sustainable Development arena;
- Can be used to engage and mobilize internal and external stakeholders to further the University's strategic intent to become a leading university in Africa.
- Fosters the realization of the University's vision of being a thought leader of knowledge generation for societal transformation and development.



Rationale of the MAK SDR

- The UN 17 SDGs are our world's call to action on the most pressing challenges and opportunities facing humanity and the natural world.
- With their unique role in creating and sharing knowledge, universities have a direct role in addressing the challenges set out in transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- MAK recognizes that it is an integral part of society, and as such is a significant contributor to the positive shaping and evolution of the world we live in.
- Sustainable development is an institutional strategic focus area, and enables us to give expression to our purpose, ensure ongoing relevance and impact, and push the boundaries of knowledge and practices for a better world.



Rationale - 2

- Through its strategic plan, MAK is committed to the values of sustainable national development and is fully aware that its activities can produce significant impact.
- Through its core roles teaching and learning, research, and community engagement, MAK is playing a leading role in the achievement of SDGs.
- The SDR will document the university's contribution to achievement of SDGs, increase its visibility, but also identify gaps to be addressed to foster sustainability




Aims of the MAK SDR

- Articulating the philosophical position on sustainable development across research, teaching and operations
- Taking stock of evidence base on knowledge, solutions, innovations, technologies and pathways supporting the implementation of SDGs
- Identifying gaps, successes and opportunities for learning and increasing impact on sustainable development
- Fostering internal and external stakeholder collaboration and mobilization in support, resources and partnerships for realizing sustainable development

The main questions/focus

- How is the university curricula relevant and contributing to achievement of SDGs?
- How are the university research/project aligned and enhancing the achievement of SDGs
- How sustainable are the university operations in relation to achievement of SDGs (fleet management, waste management, energy and water efficiency, greening of university etc)
- Do we focus on all SDGs, or we select a few?



The methodology (Group work)

- Qualitative and quantitative
- Case studies: From selected Colleges/Schools, programmes/curricula (Group 1)
- Projects/Research mapping; we can selected a few research/projects for deeper analysis (Group 2)
- Publication metrics SDGs publication mapping e.g.
 Scopus search queries (Group 3)
- Do we focus on all SDGs, or we select a few?
- Funding sources?
