The innovation journey with the Scholars' projects using the HCD introduced different ways of how to generate innovations with high adoption probability.

A number of questions arose during our journeys and we often found it important to stop, reflect, review and devise a worthwhile campus to better navigate our innovation journeys. This required moving back and forth during the design processes.

Hon. Min, ladies and gentlemen, the scholars were further treated to an innovation excursion where the Innovation Ecosystem in Ghana was explored.

This was an exciting and priceless experience to the scholars who returned with "Fire in their Bellies" to implement some of the lessons learnt.

We have since become innovation-intentional at CAES to the extent that yesterday the 9th August 2022, CEAS unveiled its co-created Transformational Change Pact that is innovation-intentional.
